Walk Reports for Sunday 11th April 2021 – Car Transport meet

With the easing of Covid restrictions from 5^{th} April, and the planned further easing of travel restrictions from 26^{th} April, the committee decided to restart club activities. We decided on a gradual return to the hills, with outings using car transport on 11^{th} April, before a planned first coach outing on 2^{nd} May. We had a total of 30 book for 11^{th} April, with 15 in each of the Moderate and Challenging groups. The current restrictions allow for a maximum of 15 in a group, with an advisory 6-8 in each walking group.

Challenging Group Ben Lawers Range

We had 1 person cancel from the Challenging group, and after a couple of group changes, we all started from the Lawers car park at 08.30, with 6 in the Challenging and 8 in the Less Challenging groups. The weather was lovely and sunny in all directions, with light winds, after a hard overnight frost. Although higher areas had snow and ice, we didn't need ice axes or crampons, but some members used "spikies" on the steeper slopes. Tony Jackson flew his drone during breaks, to record some stunning photography. The Challenging group did Beinn Ghlas, Ben Lawers, followed by Meall Corranaich. The Less Challenging group did Beinn Ghlas, followed by Ben Lawers. Both groups returned via the path below Beinn Ghlas, to join the outward route back to the car park. All members arrived at the car park between 14.00 and 14.30, just as the skies were starting to locally cloud over, with some light snow. Everyone enjoyed the walks, and were obviously pleased to be back on the hills.

Moderate Group Comrie Circular Hill Walk

With no cancellations, we had a total of 15, and split into groups of 8 and 7. Both groups did the same walk, starting from the car park by the Comrie Golf Club. The route ascended on the east side of the Deil's Cauldron to Balmuick Farm, to continue by Silver Hollow, to the first break by the remains of a stone circle. The route continued to Braefordie, where some ponds are being developed for wild birds, and down through Balmenoch Wood, to the lunch stop by a waterfall. The route utilised some former estate driveways, followed by a final stop by Milton Burial Ground. The return to the car park was by the track through Laggan Wood. The first group reached the car park by 14.00, and the other group at 15.00. The weather, although chilly, remained dry and mostly sunny, with little wind. There were fine views in all directions, from various points along the way and several sightings of Red Kites. Everyone said they enjoyed the walk, and so good to be out on such a good weather day.
